Course Objectives

Expected Learning Outcomes

At the end of the course, you will be expected to perform in speaking, listening, reading and writing Korean at a basic level of proficiency. You should also demonstrate a level of cultural understanding suitable for performance of assigned tasks in Korean (e.g., how to make a request in an appropriate way).

Students will be submitting assignments on Google Classroom and Google Drive.

Course Requirements

1. Come to class well-prepared. You will receive daily grades.
2. Arrive on time to class.
3. Be ready to perform each hour.
4. Turn in the assignments on time.

Evaluation

The grade for this course will be based on total points. There will be at least two assignments per week.
