Course Objectives

A comprehensive review of Korean along with reading, communicative exercises and discussions of texts and other media covering personal topics and topics of current interest. Emphasis is on the development and mastery of sentence structures necessary for daily reading and conversation in a Korean environment.

Expected Learning Outcomes

At the end of the course, you will be expected to perform in speaking, listening, reading and writing Korean at an intermediate level of proficiency. You should also demonstrate a level of cultural understanding suitable for performance of assigned tasks in Korean (e.g., how to make a request in an appropriate way).

Students will prepare TOPIK (test of proficiency in Korean) and aim to pass the level 1.

Students will submit assignments on Google Classroom and Google Drive.

Course Requirements

1. Come to class well-prepared. You will receive daily grades for participation.
2. Arrive on time to class.
3. Ask before going to the restroom in Korean.
4. Be ready to perform each hour. Participate actively, paying close attention to everything you hear and see and anticipating the responses to questions even when you're not called upon.
5. **Turn in the assignments on time.**

Evaluation

The grade for this course will be based on total points. There will be at least two assignments weekly.
