
Senior Information

- <u>Class of 2022 TN Promise Application</u> the TN promise application for the Class of 2022 seniors is open now. The deadline to complete the application is November 1, 2021 at www.tnpromise.gov.
- <u>**TN Promise Eligibility</u>** A virtual webinar will be on November 8th, 2021 with a February 1, 2022 deadline to complete the requirement for students to maintain TN Promise eligibility. Students can complete the requirement in one of two ways. They can view the mandatory webinar via their tnAchieves CONNECT account at their convenience. It will also be an option for counselors to show the webinar to students in groups and report attendance back to tnAchieves so we are able to update our records. We do ask counselors to encourage CONNECT sign in as this is how many tnAchieves mentors will communicate with their students.</u>
- <u>2022-2023 FAFSA</u> the 2022-2023 FAFSA is now open for completion! FAFSA applications must be completed at <u>www.fafsa.gov</u> by February 1, 2022 to remain eligible for TN Promise.
- <u>Community Service</u> Students can begin complete their 8 hours of community service on November 2, 2021 after the TN Promise application deadline. We will offer virtual community service opportunities to students just as we have in the past.
- **Handbook:** The Class of 2022 handbook will be sent to student's personal address at the beginning of November. Virtual copies will also be available.
- <u>Scholarship Opportunity</u>: The application for the 2021-22 United States Senate Youth Program (USSYP) is open. This opportunity is open to junior or senior high school students. Two students will be selected as Tennessee delegates to participate in the annual Washington Week experience which includes a variety of events that promote a unique understanding of the structure of the United States government. The program sponsor, the Hearst Foundation, also offers selected state finalists a \$10,000 undergraduate scholarship. Additional information, including the application link, can be found on the RHS Counseling Website under Student Opportunities. Student applications are due by 11:59 p.m. CT on October 15, 2021.

If you are dropping something off for a student: there is a table in the office that has a sharpie and stickers. Please put your student's name on the sticker and place item on the table. We will get the item to the student during the school day. Please do not wait in our office for the student to come.

Acceptable things to drop off:

- Lunchbox that was forgotten at home, in car.
- Laptop or computer charger
- Homework, book
- Glasses
- Note to tell your child they are a bus rider or car rider that day
- Water <u>ONLY</u>

Not acceptable:

• Outside food (fast food, restaurant food, etc.). Reminder, breakfast and lunch are free to ALL students daily.

We **do not pull students** out of class to visit a parent/guardian in the front lobby. The **ONLY** time you may visit with your child is to administer medicine.

Dismissing Students

In order for a student to be dismissed, the following must be done:

- A student brings a hand-written parent note in the morning of the school day they need to be dismissed. The note MUST have guardian's name giving permission, phone number, and time the student is to be dismissed.
- Parent/Guardian comes into the front office with their driver's license to check the student out.

NOT acceptable for dismissal:

- Phone calls
- Emails
- Faxes
- Self-dismiss

Drivers' Permit:

- Must fill out an SF-1010 form, these can be picked up in the front office.
- After filling out the form, the front office assistants will check for the following State of Tennessee Requirements:
 - Student must be at least 15 years of age
 - Students must pass more than half of their courses during the previous semester
 - Students must have fewer than 15 non-consecutive unexcused absences and/or days of suspension during the previous semester OR fewer than 10 consecutive unexcused absences and/or days of suspension during the previous semester.
- When the student's form is ready, they will be notified when to pick up in the front office.
- Please allow 24 hours to process.
- Forms are valid for 30 days from the date. When expired, students will have to complete the process again.
- **If students owe any fees (books, laptops, charger, etc). They will not receive an SF1010 form until these fees are paid. **
