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ACT Exam for Juniors- March 1, 2022

All Juniors take the Official ACT on Tuesday, March 1, 2022, during the school day at Rossvie High School. Regular review and practice with content skills and test-day strategies are helpful and can be the difference in an increased score. Please encourage your student to begin preparing for the ACT.

After School Credit Recovery

If your student failed an academic course & would like to make it up, after school credit recovery will be starting Jan 31. Contracts available in guidance or from your teacher now. After School Credit Recovery is a program that allows students the opportunity to regain lost credits in one or more core academic courses by completing assigned course work online. Math and science credit recovery meets after school on Mondays and Tuesdays and English and social studies credit recovery meets on Wednesdays and Thursdays. All credit recovery is from 2:30-4:30 pm and transportation is not provided. To register for credit recovery, students will pick up a contract from their teacher or from guidance and return to the guidance office. Spots are filled in the order completed contracts are returned to guidance.

SUMMARY: RHS Cadets participated in the 2021 Wreaths Across America Ceremony on Fort Campbell, Kentucky as their Service Learning Project for the 2021-2022 School Year. Working alongside the U.S. Army Garrison, Fort Campbell and the Clarksville – Sunrise Rotary Club, Cadets planned and implemented the event that was comprised of a formal wreath laying ceremony which recognized all branches of the U.S. Military, as well as our nations POW/MIAs. This was followed by a ceremony where cadets told the stories of the Divisions History and, along with military and community members, emplaced 101 wreaths along the T.C. Freeman Access Road fence line to represent Soldiers who died serving with the 101st from World War II, Vietnam, Desert Shield and Desert Storm, Operation Enduring Freedom, Operation Iraqi Freedom, and the Divisions many Peacekeeping and humanitarian missions. At the same time, a platoon of cadets was at Mount Olive Cemetery in Clarksville, Tennessee assisting in the Historical Foundation ceremony and emplacing wreaths on the grave stones of all service members that are interred there.

Visitors in the Front office

If you are dropping something off for a student: there is a table in the office that has a sharpie and stickers. Please put your student's name on the sticker and place item on the table. We will get the item to the student during the school day. Please do not wait in our office for the student to come.

Acceptable things to drop off:

- Lunchbox that was forgotten at home, in car.
- Laptop or computer charger
- Homework, book
- Glasses
- Note to tell your child they are a bus rider or car rider that day
- Water ONLY

Not acceptable:

Outside food (fast food, restaurant food, etc.). This is a CMCSS policy. Reminder, breakfast and lunch are free to ALL students daily.

Dismissing Students

In order for a student to be dismissed, the following must be done:

- A student brings a hand-written parent note in the morning of the school day they need to be dismissed. The note MUST have guardian's name giving permission, phone number, and time the student is to be dismissed.
- Parent/Guardian comes into the front office with their driver's license to check the student out.

NOT acceptable for dismissal:

- Phone calls
- Emails
- Faxes
- Self-dismiss

Drivers' Permit:

- Must fill out an SF-1010 form, these can be picked up in the front office.
- After filling out the form, the front office assistants will check for the following State of Tennessee Requirements:
 - Student must be at least 15 years of age
 - Students must pass more than half of their courses during the previous semester
 - Students must have fewer than 15 non-consecutive unexcused absences and/or days of suspension during the previous semester OR fewer than 10 consecutive unexcused absences and/or days of suspension during the previous semester.
- When the student's form is ready, they will be notified when to pick up in the front office.
- Please allow 24 hours to process.
- Forms are valid for 30 days from the date. When expired, students will have to complete the process again.
- **If students owe any fees (books, laptops, charger, etc). They will not receive an SF1010 form until these fees are paid. **
