TN Ready Message to Parents

We will begin TNReady testing on Monday, April 17th and will conclude on Friday, April 28th. Students who are enrolled in English I, English II, Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II, US History, and Biology courses will take a TNReady End of Course assessment. Testing will primarily take place first thing in the morning and will last (for most students) until lunchtime. We do have specific procedures regarding technology and personal materials that we wanted to share with you and ask for your support in the implementation of these procedures.

- 1) Students will not be allowed to have their cell phones in the classroom or in their possession during testing. We have been instructed to collect all cell phones/smart watches/headphones/and earbuds/etc in an individual envelope that is personalized for your student. The aforementioned electronic devices will be secured for the duration of the testing window and returned to students once testing has concluded.
- 2) Students will have access to their water bottles (if they bring their own) during breaks. These will be housed on counters within the classroom.
- 3) TNReady assessments will be given through a testing application on your student's laptop. Please make sure that your student's laptop is fully charged each night.
- 4) Testing starts at 7:30 AM. Please make sure that your student has a good night's sleep, eats breakfast, and is at school by 7:25 AM.

VERY IMPORTANT: In order to ensure a secure testing environment, we will **NOT** dismiss students who are taking an End of Course exam during the exam period. Please plan appointments and dismissals for after lunchtime during this two-week window.

Please take a moment to partner with us and discuss these expectations with your students as well. In this manner, we can ensure that testing goes smoothly for all students.




WHO: Rossview JROTC Cadets

Summary: Clarksville CPR consultants visited Rossview High School to teach cadets how to recognize and control various types of bleeding injuries. Cadets received training using tourniquets, packing wounds and pressure dressings. They were also taught the new and correct way to perform CPR on anyone in need, as well as the steps to take to ensure their safety. For example; wearing personal protective equipment, dialing 911 and obtaining a medical kit and AED to assist in emergency response.

Graduation Information for Seniors:

Graduation Attire

- Option #1: White-collared dress shirt, black tie or bow ties with no pattern (no western bolos), black dress slacks, and black dress shoes. No tennis shoes, crocs or shoes with patterns! If any of these items are an issue, see your guidance counselor, Dr. Herndon, or Dr. Sanders.
- Option #2: Dress or skirt of any color (should not be longer than your graduation gown) and black shoes. No flip flops, house shoes, or Crocs. You will need bobby pins for your graduation cap. If any of these items are an issue, see your guidance counselor, Dr. Herndon, or Dr. Sanders
- All graduates: Graduation caps are worn flat on the top of your head, not on the back of your head. NOTHING IS TO BE WRITTEN ON YOUR GRADUATION CAP! When you pick up your gown, hang it up to remove the wrinkles. Do not iron your graduation gown.
- Your attire will be checked by faculty members as you enter the Dunn Center. If you are not dressed according to the dress code, you will not be permitted to walk.

General Information

Graduation will be held at the Austin Peay State University Dunn Center, Saturday, May 27, 2022 at 3:00 PM

Guest Ticket Information

- Each student will receive a maximum of ten (10) guest tickets.
- EVERYONE must have a ticket to be admitted. This includes minor children.
- NO STUDENT WILL BE GIVEN MORE THAN TEN (10) TICKETS UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES.
- *Please be aware that if we have to change the location of our graduation ceremonies, the number of guests that will be allowed to attend may significantly decrease. This is not likely, but possible.

Guest Guidelines for Graduation (Per Austin Peay State University)

- Those who plan to attend graduation must be able to affirm the following:
 - They have not been in close contact with a confirmed case of Covid-19 in the last fourteen (14) days. *This does not apply to medical professionals, first responders, or other individuals who encounter COVID-19 as part of their professional or caregiving duties while wearing appropriate PPE.
- Every guest entering the Dunn Center, regardless of age, must have a ticket.
- Every guest entering the Dunn Center, regardless of age, must sit in their designated seat.
- Guests will not be allowed on the Dunn Center floor before, during, and after the ceremony.
- Guests should enter the Dunn Center through the entrance designated on the front of their admission ticket. The doors will open one (1) hour prior to the start of the ceremony.

Additional Information

- Absolutely no "air horns" or disruptive devices will be tolerated during the graduation ceremony. Any disruptive attendants will be escorted from the building by law enforcement.
- Austin Peay offers a free live webcast of each commitment ceremony. A link to the webcast will be available
 on the commencement webpage within 24 hours of each ceremony. Commencement is also aired live on
 CDE Lightband Channel 9, Spectrum Cable Channel 192, and AT&T Uverse Channel 99. It can also be
 heard on WAPX-FM radio, 91.9 MHZ. We are delighted that family members from anywhere in the world will
 be able to hear their loved one's name called during this important event.

Visitors in the Front office

If you are dropping something off for a student: there is a table in the office that has a sharpie and stickers. Please put your student's name on the sticker and place item on the table. We will get the item to the student during the school day. Please do not wait in our office for the student to come.

Acceptable things to drop off:

- Lunchbox that was forgotten at home or in car.
- Laptop or computer charger
- Homework, books, school supplies

- Glasses or other personal items
- Note to tell your child they are a bus rider or car rider that day
- Water ONLY

Not acceptable:

• Outside food (fast food, restaurant food, etc.)

Dismissing Students

Reminder: We do not permit parent check out during pep rallies, assemblies, standardized testing (TN Ready, ACT, Dual Credit, etc.), and semester exam periods. Please make plans in advance with your student. Thank you for helping us maintain a safe, orderly, and academic-focused school environment.

In order for a student to be dismissed, the following must be done:

- A student brings a hand-written parent note in the morning of the school day they need to be dismissed. The note MUST have guardian's name giving permission, phone number, and time the student is to be dismissed.
- Parent/Guardian comes into the front office with their driver's license to check the student out.

NOT acceptable for dismissal:

- Phone calls
- Emails
- Faxes
- Self-dismiss

Drivers' Permit:

- Must fill out an SF-1010 form, these can be picked up in the front office.
- After filling out the form, the front office assistants will check for the following State of Tennessee Requirements:
 - Student must be at least 15 years of age
 - Students must pass more than half of their courses during the previous semester
 - Students must have fewer than 15 non-consecutive unexcused absences and/or days of suspension during the previous semester OR fewer than 10 consecutive unexcused absences and/or days of suspension during the previous semester.
- When the student's form is ready, they will be notified when to pick up in the front office.
- Please allow 24 hours to process.
- Forms are valid for 30 days from the date. When expired, students will have to complete the process again.
